CMS to Recover Overpayment on Secondary Payments

On April 1, 2011, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid implemented a Change Request directing the Common Working File (CWF) to accept both Medicare Secondary Payer (MSP) and Non-MSP lines on the same claim or adjustment. As a result of this change, Medicare erroneously issued secondary payments and applied the total Medicare allowed amount towards the beneficiary's deductible obligation on some claims processed between April 2, 2011, and November 4, 2011. These overpayments will be recovered. If you have received an overpayment of this nature, you will be asked to return funds paid in error, if not already returned.

The AMA has learned of numerous physician practice complaints about claim rejections and is addressing this issue with key stakeholders. It could be due to the conversion from Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Version 4010 to Version 5010, which happened January 1, 2012.
