### Modifier 59 Webinar Available

Correctly reporting modifier 59 can be a challenge even for the experienced coder, but doing so inappropriately puts your practice at risk. Reporting the modifier incorrectly could be considered over-coding, thus causing a compliance problem. Failing to append Modifier 59 when appropriate may result in lost revenue. ## Take Steps Now to Avoid 2013 e-Prescribing Penalty

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) is urging physicians to report at least 10 electronic prescriptions by June 30, 2012, to avoid the 2013 Medicare e-prescribing penalty, which will be a 1.5 percent reduction of 2013 Medicare Part B payments. Physicians may also file for a hardship exemption, but must do so by June 30, 2012.
